## **USER'S GUIDE**

The Singapore Medical Literature Index  $1980 \sim 1993$  consists of two sections: the subject section and the author section. All the subjects follow the Medical Subject Headings (MeSH) system of the National Library of Medicine (NLM) of the U.S.A.. Indexing work was carried out by personnel at the Medical Library, National University of Singapore, Singapore.

This publication has been compiled in accordance with the following guidelines: In principle, a database-oriented bibliography, compiled by SEAMIC, follows the same format as the Index Medicus. The bibliography therefore consists of a subject section and an author section, and is indexed according to the Medical Subject Headings (MeSH) 1995. It also follows Index Medicus citation format, but does not include the monograph chapter.

## SUBJECT SECTION

Each entry contains the following items:

- 1) original English title of article or the English translation of the title
- 2) first author (if more than one) or sole author
- 3) journal title abbreviation
- 4) date of issue (year, month, day)
- 5) volume number
- 6) issue, part, or supplement
- 7) inclusive pagination
- 8) the notation Eng. Abstr. for those non-English articles that provide an English abstract
- 9) an abbreviation indicating the language of the article, if other than English

Example of typical citations in the subject section are as follows:

## ABDOMEN

Pathogenesis and rational of treatment of recurrent abdominal pain. Aiyathurai JEJ, et al. **Ann Acad Med Singapore** 1981 Oct;10(4):415-418

Each article is cited under one or more subject heading.

The non-English-language abbreviations are as follows:

## **AUTHOR SECTION**

References in the author section cite all authors' names, up to six authors for one title. These are followed by the title of the article, and then by the other bibliographic data as given in the subject section.

Complete citations are printed only under the first author's name; all other authors' names are cross-referenced to the full reference under the first author's name, as in the following citation:

Abbreviations of months are as follows:

Jan January Feb February Mar March April Apr May May Jun June Jul July Aug August Sep September Oct October Nov November Dec December

As for abbreviations of journal titles, SEAMIC follows the International Standard ISO-4-1984: Documentation-International Code for the Abbreviation of Titles of Periodicals.
